BIB 100 - BIBLE CONTENT OVERVIEW

3 CR. HRS.

Monday 6-8:30 pm

An introductory study of the Bible. Included in the study will be a brief analysis of each book noting the theme, historical development, personalities, main events, and progression of the redemptive system. (Required course)

FALL 2024 GENERAL COURSE OFFERINGS

BOT 111 – OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY I (Law & History) 3 CR. HRS.

Tuesday 6-8:30 pm

An introduction to the Law and History Books of the Old Testament. The course teaches the history of Israel from Genesis to Esther and examines God's covenant with His chosen people, customs, and maps

ST 310 – BIBLE INTERPRETATION (HERMENEUTICS) 3 CR. HRS.

Monday 6-8:30 pm

A study of the principles and methods which aid in determining the correct meaning and the message of Scripture.

BNT 115 - THE LIFE OF CHRIST (The Gospels)

3 CR. HRS.

Tuesday 6-8:30 pm

A treatment of the life and ministry of Jesus Christ from a chronological viewpoint. Students come to know Jesus' purpose and significance by studying the major events and movements of His life as presented in the four gospels. Confidence in the gospels as historical resources is also explored. This class is highly recommended for new Christians.

BNT 416 REVELATION & THE END TIMES

3 CR. HRS.

Thursday 6-8:30 pm

An in-depth study and examination of the last days as outlined by the Apostle John. Areas considered are passages from Old Testament prophetic book, the tribulation period, the return of the Jewish Nation, millennial age, and the final judgment.

BNT 317 – ROMANS

3 CR. HRS.

Tuesday 6-8:30 pm

In depth study of the Apostle Paul's Epistle to the Roman Church. Verse-by-verse treatment emphasizing justification, sanctification and election.
